Extra 8.3% on overtime payments

Following a legal case there is now a duty for an employer to give additional recompense for annual leave of those that undertake <u>regular</u> overtime. The Unions have negotiated the additional payment from an initial 7.7% to 8.3%, which we have been informed will become payable on <u>all</u> overtime payments with effect from 1 April 2017.
